GLOUCESTER v. BRIDGWATER

CITY TEAM'S GOOD WIN

The Gloucester team made the journey to Bridgwater to-day by private motor cars, the party leaving the Monico shortly after 10 o'clock. Fred Webb (captain) was unable to take his place in the side, and the vacancy at centre three-quarter was filled by S. Burford (Drybrook), who assisted Manchester at outside half against Gloucester on Monday.

In the first fixture between the clubs at Kingsholm at Christmas Gloucester won easily by 6 tries (18 points) to 1 goal 1 try (8 points), but with the weakened fifteen doing duty this afternoon the City were likely to be hard pressed to hold their own.
