### GLO'STER LOSE TO OXFORD UNIVERSITY

Gloucester lost at home to Oxford University at Kingsholm, after a thrilling game by 4 goals (1d. 1p.) (17 points) to 2 tries (6 points).

The City were short of Boughton, McCanlis and James, and it was behind the scrum the team suffered in comparison with the University. C. C. Tanner made his first appearance of the season for Gloucester, and scored a brilliant try. The other try-getter was Steele-Perkins.

Oxford also scored two tries, both converted by Henley, who also placed a penalty goal. Jenkins dropped a goal, and eleven of the winners' points resulted from successful goal kicks.

The South Africans, who meet Wales at Swansea to-day, beat a combined team of Neath and Aberavon by 8 points to 3, the winning score being obtained in the last minute.
