ENGLAND'S GREAT WIN AT TWICKENHAM

England gained a decisive victory over Scotland in the Calcutta Cup match at Twickenham by 2 goals 2 tries (16 points) to 1 try (3 points), and thus shared with Ireland and Wales the title of International Champions for the season with two wins each. Aarvold (2), Tanner, and Black scored tries for the winners, Burland converting two.

Gloucestershire's three representatives in the team – Brown, Burland and Tanner – all did splendidly, the former giving a perfect display at full-back. Burland was the outstanding three-quarter, and made the openings for three of the tries.
