GLOUCESTER v. MOSELEY

BRIGHT, OPEN GAME AND FREE SCORING

The evening match at Kingsholm on Thursday between Gloucester and Moseley provided some bright open football, which was greatly enjoyed by the spectators. Gloucester played Thomas at outside half vice Taylor, and Loveridge came in at three-quarter.

Gloucester played a capital game in the first half, and tries were scored by Bayliss (2), Hemmings, and Ayliffe, Millington converting two. S. Huins crossed for Moseley with a good try following an intercepted pass by his brother, and Batchelor added the goal points.

The City fell off on the restart, and Moseley put on pressure. S. Huins, who ran strongly on the right wing, added to Moseley's score with another fine try, and Batchelor converted, whilst Spencer dropped a good goal. Gloucester improved after these reverses, and Ayliffe and Ford scored tries, one of which Williams converted.
