FOOTBALL NOTES

The chief match of importance on Saturday last was the County Championship Final, which was played at Bristol. Leicestershire, giving a really fine performance, defeated Gloucestershire by 14 points to 6 points.

It is generally admitted that the Tigers[*sic*] were a superior team all round, their seven forwards quite outplaying the home pack, both in the scrums and in the loose. Sambrook, at back, was the better of the two backs, whilst Day, Smallwood, and Prentice were also in good form.

Gloucestershire were weakly represented at right wing three-quarter, Spoons evidently feeling the pressure of Anno Domini. Pickles, also, was not up to his best form. Two undoubted successes were Hughes and Dr. Taylor. The latter, I see, has been invited to join the English team in their last international match with France at Paris.
