GLOUCESTER'S BIG SCORE

CINDERFORD BEATEN BY THIRTY POINTS

For the evening match with Cinderford at Kingsholm on Monday Gloucester played Meadows and Hiam for Davis and Evans (forward), and Loveridge replaced Hough (injured) at wing three-quarter.

Cinderford, who only started the season on Saturday, had a somewhat mixed side.

The match was only moderately patronised, the gate receipts amounting to £22.

The football generally was very scrappy, and though Gloucester won so easily the form was anything but satisfactory. Jack Stephens was a brilliant individualist, and of the eight tries scored he was credited with four, running in twice from over halfway.

Other try-getters were Lewis (2), Franklin and James, and Boughton kicked six goals and hit the upright with another shot.

The Cinderford forwards played a bustling game, and were dangerous on several occasions with loose rushes, but Boughton was wonderfully safe and cleared with huge punts to touch.

G. Greenman placed two penalty goals for Cinderford.
