GLOUCESTER LOSE TO PLYMOUTH ALBION

Gloucester were not at full strength against Plymouth Albion, at Kingsholm last week, and were further handicapped in losing the services of A. Hough (wing three-quarter) early in the game. The handicap proved too great for the City, and the visitors gained a well-deserved victory by 3 tries (9 points) to 1 penalty goal (3 points). Boughton kicked the goal for Gloucester.

The Albion were splendidly served forward, where J. Hanley, the English winger, was very conspicuous, and the backs displayed better combination.

To-day Gloucestershire met Cornwall at Redruth in the County Championship, and the first of the English trials was fixed for Newcastle. Four Bristol players (Tucker, Burland, Brown and Lillicrap) were honoured with places.
