GLO'STER FACE CHELTENHAM WITH UNCHANGED SIDE

With an eye on the 42 points Gloucester have amassed in only two matches, the selectors last night named an unchanged side to meet Cheltenham at Kingsholm tomorrow – kick-off 6.0 p.m.

Skipper Mickie Booth will lead out the team which beat Waterloo 9–3 and Lydney 33–0 for the second local derby within a week.

Interest in the Cheltenham match was heightened yesterday when the neighbouring club announced that Gary Mace, the former Gloucester premier scrum half, would be playing for them.

The selectors will not name the United team to meet Moseley United away on Saturday until after the match tomorrow evening.
