MEADOWS PAIRS UP WITH AINGE FOR COVENTRY GAME

Peter Meadows, regular winger in the premier Gloucester and County teams for several seasons, returns to first-class Rugby on Saturday when a much-depleted Gloucester team travels to Coventry.
