#### Some further Points in the Laws of Rugby Union Football.

OFF-SIDE. Many points in this rule are obvious, but the following may be of interest:

- An off-side player is not put on-side if the ball, after being kicked, accidently touches an opponent. He is, however, put on-side when—
  - (a) An opponent carrying the ball has run five yards.
  - (b) An opponent kicks the ball.
  - (c) An opponent intentionally touches the ball but fails to catch or gather it.
  - (d) One of his own team from behind him carries the ball beyond him, or kicks it forward and "follows up." Such a kicker must be inside the field of play at the moment of putting the off-side player on-side.
  - (e) The ball touches an opponent who has attempted to charge down a kick.
- 2. An off-side player must remain at least ten yards from an opponent who is waiting for the ball, or must make a move to get away from that opponent if nearer to him than ten yards.
- 3. A player cannot be off-side behind his own goal line unless he gets in front of one of his own side taking a free kick. If he does, a five yard scrum is ordered opposite the mark.
- 4. If the ball, or a player carrying the ball, accidentally touches an offside player, a scrum is ordered where it occurs.
- 5. A player is NOT off-side because he is in front of the ball, except when it is in a scrummage.

No. 5 is one which is frequently misunderstood, and a player can intercept the ball when his opponents are passing, unless he was off-side when that passing has just started from a scrum.
