GLOUCESTER A v CAINSCROSS

Played at Kingsholm on Saturday, before a small attendance.

Cainscross started with fourteen men, and the Seconds immediately invaded their opponents' territory, but Browning, with a good run, put them out of danger. Gloucester returned to the attack, and Cook went over in a scramble, but the kick failed.

The homesters again worked to the Cainscross 25 by the aid of good footwork, where a try was lost through Clarke failing to pass at the critical moment. However, a minute later Clarke went over with a pretty try, which Egerton majorised with a good kick.

The same player a minute later went over under the posts with another good effort after a nice run by a forward. Egerton converted.

Shortly afterwards Collingbourne was prominent, while only a second or two later Clarke gained his third try, Egerton this time failing with the kick.

The Seconds continued to have all the game, and Harris nearly went over, after running through half the visitors' team. Jones, however, did the trick a little later, Egerton goaling with a splendid kick. Cainscross gained temporary relief, but Collingbourne quickly reversed the positions with a clever run. The visitors again gained the centre, Westbury being prominent, but it was evident that they were no match for their opponents. Stephens, however, with a nice dribble, put them in an attacking position, and from a free Bingham landed a nice goal.

The Seconds retaliated and Humphries put Jones in with a well-timed pass, Egerton failing from the easy position. The interval shortly afterwards arrived.
