Towards the finish Gloucester kept up a persistent attack, and Stephens, who played a good game at half, got over again. The place kick failed, and soon after "no side" was called, leaving Gloucester the winners by two tries (6 points) to nil.

Gloucester was certainly the better team, but Stroud played a hard game all through, especially the forwards.
