SOUTH-WEST COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

After a keen struggle between two well-matched teams, at Bath, Gloucestershire and Somerset played a draw of five points each. Saxby scored a try for Gloucestershire in the second half which Boughton converted. This lead the visitors kept until ten minutes of the finish, when Snook crossed for Somerset, and Hazell added the goal points.

Devon beat Cornwall by 16 points to 3, and the question of leadership of the South-West is left in an interesting position. Gloucestershire and Somerset, at the head of the table with three points each, and Devon with two points have a chance of securing honours if the results of the next engagements on December 13th go a certain way. Gloucestershire have to visit Cornwall, and Devon meet Somerset at Exeter.
