GOOD WIN FOR GLOUCESTER

Gloucester, with a disorganised side, gained a meritorious victory over the United Services at Kingsholm by 2 goals (1d.) (9 pts.), to 1 try (3 pts.). Boughton dropped the goal and Price scored the try for the City, James converting.

The Services had a strong back division, including G. M. Sladen, St. Clair Ford (Internationals), T. E. Lee (Devon), and W. J. Llewellyn (Leicester).

Gloucester were short of McCanlis, G. Davies, D. Meadows, Saxby, and J. Davies. The City played short of Boughton (injured) all the second half.

After a strenuous game, the inter-University match at Twickenham on Tuesday ended in a draw of three points each, Cambridge scoring a try by Talbot, and Henley kicking a fine penalty goal for Oxford.

To-day Gloucestershire were engaged with Cornwall at Camborne in a championship match, and Gloucester and Cheltenham met at Cheltenham.
