GLOUCESTER DEFEATED AT LLANELLY

With a side considerably weakened owing to the English trial at Twickenham, and other causes, Gloucester had to call on eight reserves to complete the team to visit Llanelly for the return match. Under the circumstances the City accomplished a good performance in running the famous Welshmen to six points. Gloucester led at the interval by a try (scored by Abbey) to nil, but Llanelly recovered, and registered three tries in the second half. Masters, deputising for Boughton at full-back, played a fine game, and the forwards also did well.

England defeated The Rest in the final trial by 19 points to nil, but the score exaggerated the winners' superiority. The Rest forwards with Carpenter and Wadley (Gloucester) in the front row, put up a splendid fight, but the backs were weak in attack.

McCanlis, Burland and Barrington scored the tries for England, and the latter also dropped a goal.

In the England team to meet Wales next Saturday Tucker (Bristol) has been chosen captain, and "caps" have also been awarded to McCanlis, Burland and Barrington. F. Wadley (Gloucester) is on the reserve.

To-day Gloucester were due to oppose the Royal Air Force at Kingsholm.
