ENGLAND AND WALES DRAW

In a remarkable finish at Twickenham, England saved the game against Wales, Black landing a magnificent penalty goal with practically the last kick of the match to equalise the scores. Five minutes to the end England were leading by 8 pts. to 6. Then Wales scored a try which was converted, making the score 11–8 in their favour, only to see England draw level as stated.

Black kicked two penalty goals for England and Burland scored a try and converted; whilst for Wales, Jones-Davies and Morley scored tries, Bassett converting one, and Powell kicked a goal from a mark.

The form of the English team was not satisfactory, especially forward, and changes are expected against Ireland on February 14 at Twickenham.

Gloucester, weakened by absentees, lost to Bath by three tries (9 points) to one try (3 pts.). Price scored for the City.

To-day Gloucester were opposed to Guy's Hospital in London.
