GLOUCESTER'S FINE WIN OVER BLACKHEATH

Gloucester accomplished their best performance of the season last Saturday, when they defeated Blackheath by 3 goals 1 try (18 pts.) to 2 tries (6 pts.). It was a fine, open game and greatly enjoyed. All the Gloucester tries were scored by the three-quarters – James, Sheppard, Brooks, and McKay – the goals being kicked by James.

To-day Gloucester were engaged in the return with Lydney, and Gloucestershire, with an experimental team, played their last championship match with Cornwall.

OXFORD'S TRIUMPH

Oxford won the inter-University match, beating Cambridge at Twickenham on Tuesday by 1 goal 1 try (8 points) to 1 try (3 points). It was a great contest, Oxford's success being due to the superiority of their right wing (Lorraine and Minns) who engineered both tries for the winners.

Gloucester had a representative in the match, Grahame W. Parker (Crypt School) playing full-back for Cambridge. He did remarkably well.
