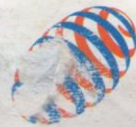

# Today's Visitors

## Gloucester RFC

Founded in 1873, Gloucester make their first visit to Clifton Lane today.

The "cherry and whites" have long been acknowledged as one of the top sides in the country and have been an ever-present force in the top flight division since leagues were formed in 1987/88.

The advent of professionalism has had considerable impact on the Gloucester club with Tom Walkinshaw emerging as their major backer. Recruitment has widened from their traditional West Country base

and their Director of Rugby is Philippe St Andre, who initially joined them as a player.

Last season they finished third in Allied Dunbar Premiership 1 with nine home wins — only Bath and Northampton Saints won





at their Kingsholm fortress — and they won six times away at Northampton Saints,

Bristol, Bedford, Sale Sharks, NEC Harlequins and London Irish.
