Consistency is a watchword for any rugby side in a division as tight as the Allied Dunbar Premiership and unfortunatley for our friends from the South West their results this season have yet to reflect that requirement as much as they would hope.

Nevertheless their performances are improving all the time and with luck they have every opportunity of climbing towards a top-four finish and a place in Europe.
