OUR VISITORS

The deep mid-winter may sound very attractive in carol singing, but loses its appeal when it decends upon us. Nevertheless, the elements have relented sufficiently to permit of a much warmer welcome to Leicester, our old friends the 'Tigers' from the Midlands, this afternoon.

Last season at Kingsholm, on November 2nd, 1968, Gloucester beat Leicester by 9 points to 3, John Spalding scoring a unconverted try and Eric Stephens landing two penalty goals.

Gloucester, will, of course, be without several players today, some being on duty with Gloucestershire in their quarter-final match of the County Rugby Championship against Hertfordshire, the Southern Group winners, at Croxley Green. This is provided, of course, that conditions have improved enough to make the game possible.

A win for Gloucestershire would bring another 'plum' for Kingsholm supporters, as it has been decided to stage the semi-final here on Saturday, February 7th in that event – and the opponents could possibly be Lancashire, the present county champions!

Lancashire are due to meet Northumberland this afternoon and have only to draw to ensure the title in the Northern group. If they lose, they will have to replay – against Northumberland!

Despite the "protests" of the few, a large crowd is expected at Kingsholm for the match between Southern Counties and South Africa on Wednesday afternoon, January 28th. The club has been snowed under by requests, and as promised, the details can now be given.

Apart from scholars, for whom the admission fee is 3/-, there will only be two prices for tickets. Stand seats will be all one price, £1, and ground tickets all 5/-.

Tickets will be on sale as from next Monday, and those for the stand are obtainable from the Gloucester secretary, Mr. Terry Tandy, 17 Ogbourne Close, Longlevens, Gloucester, to whom applications, enclosing stamped addressed envelope, must be made. Ground tickets are available at Hudson & Co., Northgate Street, Gloucester.

Next Saturday brings another big attraction to Kingsholm with the visit of the Wasps – and this match will be specially televised for BBC 2 "Match of the Day".
