## NOTES

Gloucester continue to add to their remarkable run of successes, and the latest win at Bristol, where only Cardiff had been successful this season, is not the least of their performances. It is early days yet to begin to look up records in matches won and in points, but at the present rate of progress both these records can be broken.

To-day the famous "All Whites" make their first appearance at Kingsholm since the war, and will provide one of the stiffest hurdles of the season. Like most opponents they fell heavily to the all-conquering Cardiff, but have a good record, which reads, played 27, won 19, drawn 5, lost 3, points for 310 against 189.

The "United" are now a nicely balanced team, although they have fallen on the last two Saturdays to strong opposition. The return of D. Gladwin, now demobilised, is noted with pleasure, and he showed good form against Bristol United.
