In the early stages of this thrilling contest Newport appeared to have the game well in hand, but Gloucester fought back magnificently, and at the final whistle, after a remarkable fluctuation of fortunes both sides had worthily shared the 42 points so well scored.

We seem to have formed the habit - worthy or otherwise - of statistical details of matches in these Notes, so that in case this front

"Bob" Dibble, in "A Peep in my Diary" to-day, describes Gloucester as a "a great side who could always give Newport a hard game." We fully endorse his opinion.

The application by Wynford Davies, the young Pontypridd and Welsh Schoolboy International, to assist Newport is welcome and not untimely, as it should provide the answer to a problem that has been apparent to the selection committee all this season — that of finding a successor to Jim Hawkins. Wynford Davies and his young partner caused a big stir in Rugby circles last season on their selection for Wales in the first representative game against England, without having had previous experience of first-class Rugby.
