the 2nd Battalion last Spring are back in England.

One welcome bit of news is that a spirit of close co-operation between the Rugby Club and North Gloucestershire Combination has materialised, which augers well for the future of rugby in the City. One of the first results of this is the securing by their mutual efforts of two rugby pitches in the Estcourt Road area for the use of local clubs.

Patrons are reminded that, as last year, the proceeds of the sale of these programmes will be devoted to the Gloucester Rugby Football Memorial Fund. The appeal of our President (A. Alcock, Esq.) at the beginning of last season still holds good, and the promoters of the Fund will continue to make every effort to secure and equip a permanent ground for the use of local clubs, which will be a memorial to old players who fell in the two World Wars.
