Gloucester and Gloucestershire Rugby men will mourn this week the passing of one of their stalwarts of 40 years ago - **Gordon Vears**. His father was Chairman of the Club Committee, and his brother Lindsay also played. Gordon was captain in 1907-08, and captained the County when the Championship was won in 1913. He then left the city for Walsall and played for Moseley and later Leicester. He did much for the Walsall club and was Vice-President of the N. Midlands R.U. and President of the Staffordshire R.U.
