The result at Portsmouth was not unexpected, but it was the class of the English centre, Bennett, which had most to do with the defeat. Tom Price took on the role of goal-kicker, and his general form just now makes it difficult to understand why he has failed to secure recognition in representative games.

Bath's team to-day show unfamiliar names in the three-quarter line, but the other departments contain players of experience, and a good game should result Gloucester won at Bath 14-8 earlier in the season. Bath's record to date is P. 25. W. 10, D. 2, L. 13, points for 212, against 248.

The "United" team visit Bath with a defeat in their home game with Bath United to spur them on, and as they are a better balanced side than earlier in the season they should give a good account of themselves.

The County's defeat in the Semi-Final last week was so unexpected that those hearing the news at Kingsholm did not believe it when it first came through. "Ifs" and "whys" were heard from all sides from those who travelled to Bristol, but leaving out the one or two occasions when Gloucestershire should have scored, they were out-manaeuvred by a bigger and stronger side who suited themselves better to the conditions.
