## NOTES.

Willie Jones came back to his best goal-kicking form, although he has yet to drop a goal this season. Rugby Union selectors present were very interested in one or two Gloucester players. J. Berry, a big second row forward, created a good impression and is retained for to-day's game. Knight also played well and in the absence of Sutton (who injured his hand at work) retains his place in the centre.

The visit of Leicester to Kingsholm is always a popular one and may to-day's game bring a good struggle. Leicester have been in and out this season, their record to date being played 10, won 4, lost 6 points for 92, against 106.
