Injuries, which affected the team little last season, are beginning to crop up more frequently and the absence of Dangerfield, Daniell and Jones is a serious loss Burrows and Sutton have now the experience of many games in the 1st XV, and the utility man, C. Dunn moves to the wing, a position he has often filled with credit.
