Let us endeavour to live up to this standard and to discourage in our midst any discourtesy to visitors and referees.

Our visitors to-day, against whom we play one match a season did not visit Kingsholm in 1946-47. These games have produced many fine encounters in the past, and may to-day's fixture equal that standard. Northampton's record to date is slightly better than Gloucester's, reading played 29, won 17, drawn 3, lost 9; points for 351, against 221.
