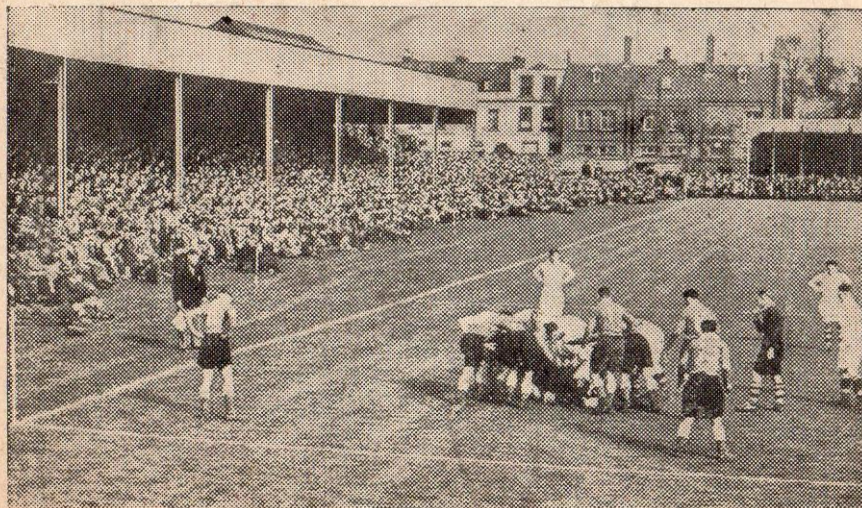

NOTES

The result last year was a draw 11—11, the Army drawing level by a penalty try late in the game. In 1949-50 The Army inflicted the heaviest defeat Gloucester have sustained at home for a long time (26-5). In 1948-49 the result was a draw 6-6, while in 1947-48 Gloucester won 25-9, Willie Jones scoring many points for Gloucester.

The Army have four Internationals in their side to-day, the halves who represented England last season and two Scottish forwards.

With several players unable to get off for this game, Gloucester call on Wally Burrows and W. Brumfit, who is now down from St. Mary's Hospital and has taken up an appointment in Gloucester.

Capt. Roberts is an England Trials player and J. Broome is a Northern Union player, who played recently for the Combined Services v. South Africa, Capt. Hazel and Lieut. Gilbert-Smith played for London Scottish against Gloucester last Saturday. Zaidman is a Schoolboy International of a few years ago.
