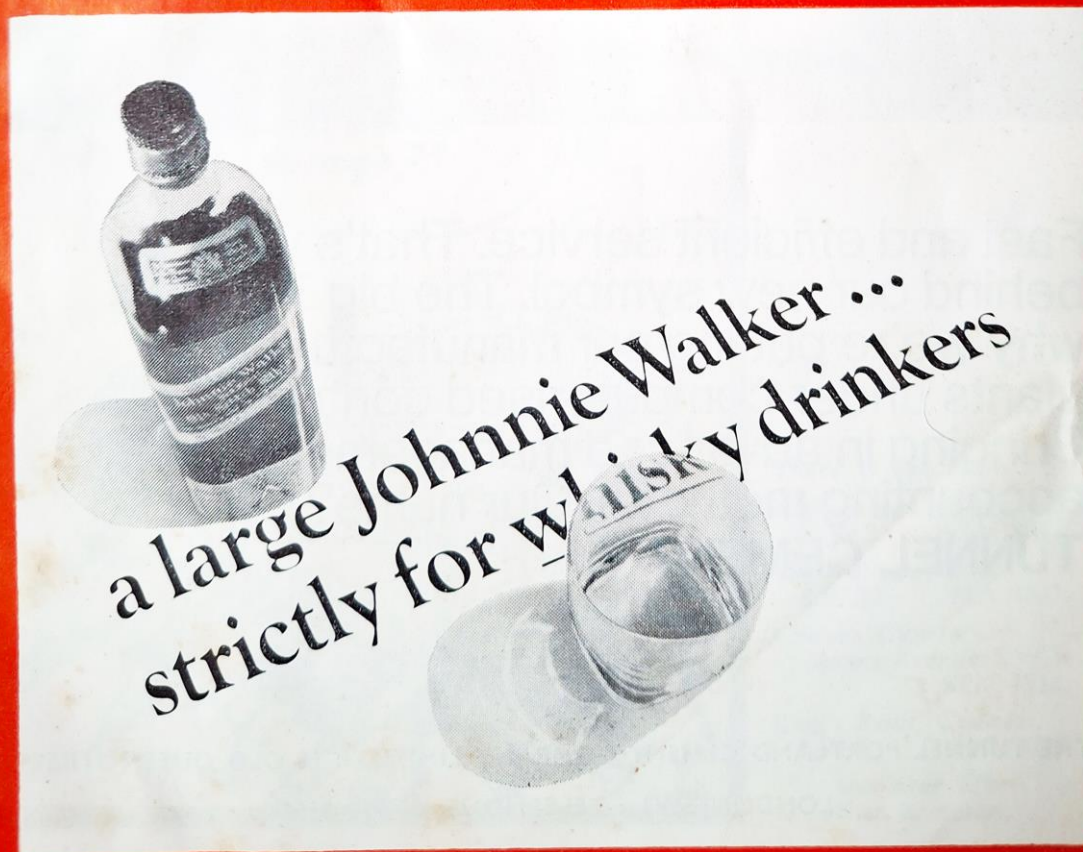

## CLUB NOTES

This is our first opportunity in 1968 to wish the players and supporters here a prosperous New Year. As far as rugby is concerned, we hope matches at all levels will continue to be as exciting as they were in 1967.

The Scottish certainly saw the old year out in style! Losing by 36 pts.—22 to Harlequins last week was one of the biggest defeats the club has ever sustained.

Much of the scoring resulted from a goal kicking duel between Gordon MacDonald of the Scottish and Bob Hiller of 'Quins.

The club was badly hit last week by the demands of the final Scottish trial in Edinburgh so today's side against Gloucester is considerably strengthened. We wish our club's internationals a successful season — beginning with the match against France at Murrayfield next Saturday.

Gloucester always present tough opposition and we are sure they will be no different today.

Over the years they have become renowned for their strong forward play allied to support kicking from the half-backs.

But since Don Rutherford, the British Isles full-back in company with Stewart Wilson in New Zealand in 1966, has been captain, Gloucester have become one of the best drilled English clubs.

Rutherford, who played for England against the All Blacks in November, has played a big part in Gloucester's changes.

Unfortunately Rutherford misses today's match because he is playing in the final England trial at Twickenham.
