We all hope you enjoy reading, inwardly digesting and obtaining players autographs (particularly our younger readers) and we look forward to hearing from you in future.

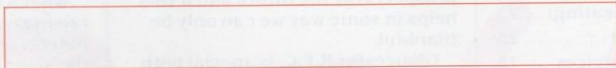




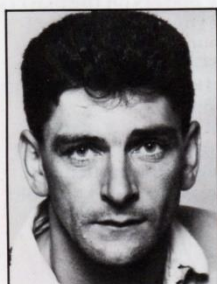

# NOTABLE INCIDENTS IN THE CLUB'S HISTORY

Compiled by 'W.B.' Reprinted from 'The Citizen', 15th November, 1924

- 1873** (September) – Club formed, with Mr F. Hartley as captain, and Mr J. P. Riddiford Hon. Secretary.
- 1873** (October) – First match v. College School on the site of the Club's present headquarters at Kingsholm. Gloucester played ten men against 'the boys' and won by 1 goal 6 tries to nil. The team was composed of F. Hartley (capt.), J. P. Riddiford, W. A. Lucy, E. L. Blossie, A. King, John Boughton, W. A. Boughton, J. A. Balfour, R. Ping and McKenzie.
- 1874** At first annual meeting a total income of £11 was shown from all sources. Mr Hartley was re-elected Captain, and Mr J. P. Riddiford Hon. Secretary, and Mr Crawley appointed Hon. Treasurer. The Committee elected were: – Messrs. E. Lynch Blossie, J. Bryan, H. Jewesbury, W. A. Lucy, W. G. Bosley, W. A. Boughton, E. T. Gardom, and A. MacDonald.
- 1876** Mr J. F. Brown succeeded to captaincy and held the position for seven years, during which period the game made rapid strides in popularity.
- 1878** Match played by electric light against Rockleaze (Bristol).
- 1878** Newport, oldest of the Welsh clubs, first met; game drawn. W. Snushall, a Gloucester half-back, sustained a broken ankle.
- 1882-3** Invincible season. Matches played 14 – Won 11, Lost 0, Drawn 3. Score for 15 goals, 20 tries; against 1 goal 4 tries. Cardiff were beaten 1 goal 6 tries to nil at the Spa; Newport defeated, at Newport, by 1 goal 1 try to nil.
- 1883** First visit of London team (including A. E. Stoddart) to the Spa. Gloucester won by 1 try (scored by F. Bagwell) to nil. Presentation of a gold watch to Mr J. F. Brown, who had left Gloucester.
- 1888-9** Swansea defeated at the Spa by 3 goals 2 tries to 1 try. Gloucester's first great victory over Cardiff, at Cardiff (after three drawn games) by 3 goals (1p) 1 try to 1 goal 2 tries. R. Grist and G. F. Dere scored the tries for the City and T. G. Smith kicked the goals.
- 1889** (February 2nd) Gloucestershire played the Maories at the Spa. The Maories won by 1 goal 1 try to 1 try (scored by R. Grist). Eleven Gloucester players appeared for the County. Gate receipts £193.
- 1890-91** Brilliant season under T. Bagwell's captaincy. Played 26 – Won 21, Lost 2, Drawn 3. Score for 27 goals 47 tries; against 5 goals 12 tries. Cardiff beaten twice, also Llanelly and Swansea once each.
- 1890-91** Last season at the Spa.
- 1891** (October 10th) Opening of Kingsholm Ground. Gloucester defeated Burton by 2 goals 4 tries (18 points) to nil. A. E. Henshaw (a former Newport player) scored first try on the new enclosure. Gate receipts at match £46 7s. 3d.
- 1894** (March) Gloucester Club suspended for a month for infringing transfer laws by playing W. Shewell, a member of the Stroud Club, against Newport.
- 1894** W. Jackson, first Gloucester born player to play for England. At the time Jackson was playing for Halifax.
- 1895-6** Retirement of T. Bagwell. Newport beat Gloucester, at Kingsholm, by 3 goals and 5 tries (30 points), giving a superb display of the handling game.
- 1896-7** Llanelly lost unbeaten record at Kingsholm by 5 points to 3. C. Hall scored the try, Percy Scott converted.
- 1897-8** Cardiff beaten, at Cardiff, by 9 points to 5. G. F. Clutterbuck dropped a goal and scored a try, which W. H. Taylor converted. Exciting game with Swansea, Gloucester scored a try and converted, but the goal points were disallowed owing to A. Stephens touching the ball after it had been placed. Instead of a victory (5 points to 3), Gloucester only made a draw (3-3).
- 1898-9** Beat Llanelly, at Llanelly, by 6 points to 3. First and only victory at Llanelly. Swansea lost unbeaten record at Kingsholm (4 points to 3), and Newport and Cardiff also defeated. Gloucester completed triumph over the famous 'Welsh Quartette'.
- 1899-00** Gloucester beat Blackheath at the Rectory Field, after a terrific struggle, by 5 points to 4. Blackheath had five internationals in the side. Gloucester v. Old Crocks ended in favour of the City team by 3 goals (1p) 2 tries to 2 tries. C. Rose scored both tries for the Old Crocks, who were represented by: A. F. Hughes, W. Gough, H. Bartlett, F. Miller, W. Pitt, T. Bagwell (capt.), Car Cummings, A. C. Williams, A. Cromwell, J. R. Price, C. Rose, A. Collins, A. White, A. Pitt and D. Phelps.
- 1900** (January 6th) International match (England v. Wales) played at Kingsholm. Wales won by 3 goals (1p) (13 points) to nil. Gloucester Club lost about £650 over the match.
- 1900-1** Record scoring against Clifton. 66 points to nil, first match and 11 goals 4 tries to nil in the second game. G. Clutterbuck scored 6 tries in the first game and G. Romans converted 11 out of the 15 tries scored in the second. Teams defeated included Blackheath (10-0), Llanelly (5 tries to nil), Cardiff (11-3), and Swansea (6-3).
- 1901-2** Gloucester beat Clifton by 10 goals 8 tries (74 points) to nil (Club record). C. Smith scored eight tries.
- 1902** Mr H. J. Boughton died (March 26th).
- 1905-6** Record aggregate in points (661). Visit of the first New Zealanders (October 19th) who beat Gloucester by 7 goals 3 tries (44 points) to nil. Gate receipts £570. Gymnasium opened by Mr R. Rea, MP (September 23rd). A. Hudson scored 41 tries this season (Club record).
- 1910-11** Gloucester's first visit to France. Beat Stade Toulousain by 18 points to 13. Llanelly beaten 19-6, Swansea 13-6, and Cardiff 15-0 (a notable win).
- 1912-3** Harlequins first appearance at Kingsholm; match drawn.
- 1913-4** Beat Harlequins at Twickenham 8 points to nil; Swansea 7-0, Cardiff 6-4, Oxford University, at Oxford, 9-6 and Llanelly 11-0.
- 1919-20** Retirement of A. Hudson. Played for Club for 13 seasons, appeared in 260 matches and scored 236 tries. Previous best, C. Smith's 141 tries.
- 1920-21** Unbeaten at home. Played 20, Won 19, Lost 0, Drawn 1. Points for 289, against 88. 'A' team also undefeated at Kingsholm this season. 'Welsh Quartette' – Cardiff, Newport, Swansea and Llanelly – again defeated. Newport's wonderful record smashed 12 points to 9. Record gate for Club match (£768 odd).
- 1924** Club's Jubilee, celebrated with special match at Kingsholm between Gloucester and Capt. W. S. Donne's XV (November 13th, 1924) followed by a banquet at the New Inn Hotel. Notable reunion of old players and officials.

## GLoucester AND RUGBY IN THE WEST

Gloucester have played a noble part in the last 50 years in keeping the Rugby game alive in the West. The local enthusiasm is wonderful. The Gloucester club is very practically interested in the development of the game amongst school-boys. Tommy Voyce, perhaps the most famous of the sixteen Gloucester Club players who have won their international caps, was originally a schoolboy player. The Club has a great record of honourable service to the game, and I hope it will long continue in its distinguished position as one of the leading Clubs under the handling code. So long as we have clubs like Gloucester we need have no fear of the future of Rugby football.

The hardest thing about becoming The Citizen's rugby reporter was learning to sleep on floors. There was no warning when I took the job that an ability to sleep in strange places was important — but I soon learnt otherwise.

I joined The Citizen sports staff during the summer and was given the job of covering Gloucester Rugby Club because Terry Phillips, our man at Kingsholm for several seasons, was standing down to run our Saturday sports paper, The Pink Un.

We agreed it would be a good idea if I got to know the lads by joining their pre-season tour to Devon. 'Don't worry,' Terry said, 'You'll be all right as long as you get your own room.'

The news when I got on the coach was good. I had my own room. Three hours later came the bad news. One of the club officials had turned up unexpectedly. He had my room and I was in a seven man room with the players.

Everything went fine until, at three o'clock in the morning, I decided it was time for bed. I wound my way unsteadily to my room and turned on the light. Six players were snoring peacefully in bed. The problem was my bed was not where I had left it. It had vanished completely. I checked all the obvious places but decided a more thorough search would have to wait until the morning. I found it the next day. The legs were on top of a wardrobe, the mattress was in the wardrobe and the base under a bed.

Things went much smoother the next night. The bed was there when I went upstairs and I distinctly remember getting into it. However, when I woke up the next morning it was gone. Oddly enough, none of the players seemed to be having these problems. I later learnt our room had been hit by a raiding party at 5.00 am. Despite these unusual sleeping arrangements, I thoroughly enjoyed the weekend and I learned a lot about the discipline of the Club which makes it so successful.

They know how to enjoy themselves but the nonsense stopped as soon as they were on the field. They're amateurs in name, but their attitude to the game and their match preparations are as

professional as any soccer club. My own playing experience was very different. Most of my schooldays were spent in the North of Scotland where soccer was all and rugby still in its infancy.

I played for the first time in my mid-teens when I moved to George Watson's College in Edinburgh — a school with a fine tradition in rugby, two of its recent products being the Hastings brothers. My appearances as a very lightweight lock forward were undistinguished but sufficient to instill a real taste for the game. My clearest memory of that period is a youthful Scott Hastings ghosting past for one of the several tries the future British Lion scored that day. I didn't get within a whisker of him all match — something I no longer feel guilty about! (I did get my revenge in a roundabout way — I beat him at darts, another sport for which young Hastings showed an aptitude).

The highlight of my brief playing career came in Paris three years ago, where I played in a team from a British journalism college against a team of French journalism students. We were one of the unlikeliest sides ever to represent our country. Most of the team had not played for years — the rest had never played before.

The French outgunned us in every department and for the first 20 minutes threatened to swamp us. But we kept knocking them down and the threatened rout never materialised. We were too inept as a team to win but when the final whistle blew they had only beaten us 11-3. Team spirit was all that kept us in that match and it is that elusive quality which makes rugby such a terrific game and which makes Gloucester such a special club.

Compared to their Division One rivals, they have few outstanding individuals and there is not a team in the land that would lay money on coming away from Kingsholm with a result.

With much of the season to come, the Cherry and Whites are still very much in the hunt for honours. I've been to Murrayfield, Cardiff Arms Park and Parc des Princes but I've never been to Twickenham. I'd like to visit Twickenham in the near future, hopefully reporting on a successful Gloucester trip.
