The Old Boys team of Christ's Hospital (Blue Coat School) our opponents to-day, have been popular visitors at Kingsholm for many years because they usually play the open type of rugby usually associated with Old Boys teams. Last Saturday they lost to Old Alleynians 16-11. Gloucester won last year 15-8. Such results should promise us a free-scoring game to-day. Pre-war players whose names recur to memory are Fulford, Shrimpton, Ross Goobey and R. A. Jones, the latter, formerly a wing-threequarter, has scored some good tries at Kingsholm. He is now Secretary of his Club.

Gloucester include three players who make their first appearance for the premier team. Collier, although a full-back, has been showing such good all-round form for the United that he has earned a trial. He is the son of R. W. Collier, the old Gloucester forward. Nicholls (younger brother of P. B. Nicholls, who played against Bristol) has been playing a sound game with the United. Serg. Major Beaven of the Gloucestershire Regt., has played for the Rhine Army and for the representative Army XV. He weighs $4\frac{1}{2}$ stone and is 6ft. 4ins. in height. Wadley (son of Fred Wadley) who played a good game at Cardiff is given a further trial.

Congratulations to the six Gloucester players in the County side to-day, particularly to Day, Dangerfield and Daniell who take part in their first County Championship match.
