EVANS, David, Dan (Danny). Scrum-Half. Height 5 ft. 2 inches, Weight 9 stone. Learned his football at Barry County School with Gus Risman (Rugby League International) and R. W. Boon (Cardiff and Wales). Subsequently played for Cardiff University, Combined Welsh Universities, Bridgend, Birkenhead Park, New Brighton (captain 1938-39), and Bath (captain 1944-45). After a Cheshire trial played for that county against Durham. Cumberland and Yorkshire 1933-34. In Welsh Trials 1933-34 and was capped against England, January 1934. Played for S. Wales v. Sir Robert Webber's XV., January 1945. Berved in the R.A.F. 1941-1945. First played for Gloncester October 1945 to January 1946. Now a master at Sir Thomas Rich's School. Missed a few games this season with an injured foot but has played regularly otherwise. Was not qualified for the County until Christmas. Provides his backs with a fine service and is strong in defence. His experience is doing much to develop Gloncester's young backs.
