After what must be the biggest hold-up ever for Gloucester Rugby, we welcome the return to normal conditions and hope that the remaining fixtures will not be interfered with. Extra games have been arranged for some of the cancelled ones—at Kingsholm v. Stroud (April 24th) and v. Bristol (April 26th); away v. Bath (April 30th).

The Gloucester Committee are to be congratulated in staging two games during the seven weeks' hold-up. On February 8th the Cardiff game was the only first-class match played. To get the ground fit for this and the County Match on March 8th, much hard work was necessary, and chief credit is due to Mr. A. Hudson, the Hon. Secretary, whose exertions left him with a severe chill, from which he has not yet fully recovered.

HOOK, WILLIAM G. Played Soccer at Sir Thomas Rich's School, where he was Captain of the XI for two years. Played for Gloucestershire Schools at Soccer and Rugby, scoring 20 points in one match against Wiltshire (2 tries, 5 conversions, 1 dropped goal). Played for South Public Schools v. North P.S. and for the Rest v. Home Counties P.S. Captained Gloucester Junior Combination v Bristol Junior Combination. First played for First XV v. U.A.U. when at school, at the age of 16, in 1938, and kicked 3 penalty goals. While still 16 played v. Bristol (away) in Sept. 1938, and received good reports on his play. Won United Cap Season 1938-9. Has now qualified for First XV Cap. An all-round athlete, he has represented the County in Athletics. Captained School cricket team and played for Gloucestershire Colts in 1938. Whilst in West Africa with the R.A.F., he captained the Station team. Is to go to Bristol this Spring for a trial at the County nets.
