Who among those present will forget that brilliant match with Bleddyn Williams scoring four tries to create a new Cardiff record of 41 in a season and the Club reaching 800 points.

There are few sides who would have contributed so readily to the occasion as did Gloucester in that match. The Cardiff Club would like to place on record its appreciation of the Gloucester Club and hope that to-day's match will be every bit as enjoyable.

Cardiff had a hard game at Newport last week, but despite a good beating in the set scrums, produced team work good enough to bring them a nine-point victory. The search for a hooker continues, and

the news that John Phillips might not be able to join, leaves the selectors no better off.

The Press have stated that Reg. Williams, of Abertillery, is eager to join the club. As a reserve to Maldwyn James last season, he might well be the man required.

The pack lack power in the set scrums, but all the forwards show their usual enthusiasm in the loose, and none did better than Elvet Jones and Gwyn Evans against Newport. They harassed the Newport midfield backs out of the game, and it was surprising that no positional changes were made to meet the situation.

The backs however, and particularly Haydn Tanner and Billy Cleaver, the now established half-back firm, were bang in form, and tackled man after man with amazing regularity. Only once did
