The late defections from the side going to Bedford further weakened the team, and with Bedford on the top of their form the result was not surprising.

It is encouraging to see Crabtree and Daniell recovered from their injuries so soon. V. Davies has also recovered (from blood poisoning) and his first game at Kingsholm will be watched with interest. He has the reputation of being a versatile player in any position, and some Welsh authorities regard him as a very good scrum half. D. A. Davies showed up well in a United game and played against Bedford last week. J. Teakle who has now come to the district, formerly played for Yeovil and played for Somerset against Gloucestershire last season.

It is good to see Johnny Thornton out again after he had apparently retired and everyone will wish him a return to the form which gained him a place in the Services Internationals.

Old Paulines surprised Gloucester two years ago by defeating them at Kingsholm. On that occasion they were indebted to Hogbin the old Guy's Hospital player whose goal-kicking turned the scales.
