LAWS OF THE GAME. Part One—Definition and Glossary of Terms.

Law 2. *Throw forward.* A throw forward occurs when the ball is propelled by the hand or arm of a player in the direction of his opponents' dead ball line. *Rebound.* A rebound occurs when the ball, after striking any part of a player except his hand, arm, or leg from the knee to the toe inclusive, travels in the direction of his opponents' dead ball line.
