LAWS OF THE GAME. Part One-Definition and Glossary of Terms.

Law 2. Throw forward. A throw forward occurs when the ball is propelled by the hand or arm of a player in the direction of his opponents' dead ball line. Rebound. A rebound occurs when the ball, after striking any part of a player except his hand, arm, or leg from the knee to the toe inclusive, travels in the direction of his opponents' dead ball line.
