NOTES

Our opponents to-day have put up some good performances at Kingsholm in recent years and have recorded a victory since the War. This season they have played only three matches to date, losing them all and scoring 11—38.

The rousing game which resulted in the 8—0 win over the unconquered Bedford last week has sent Gloucester's stock soaring in the Rugby world, and one hopes that freedom from accidents (such as were experienced last year) will enable a more regular team to be kept together.

Only three Gloucester players are absent to-day on County duty (Hook, Sutton and Hudson) a striking contrast to the previous post-war years, but the form of others in recent matches must have impressed the Selectors,

Points on the Laws of Rugby Union Football.

2. Charging at Goal Kicks-

- (a) Penalties. There is no charge and the offending side must retire at least 10 yards and remain stationary. The kicker may touch the ball again after placing it (e.g. if it rolls over).
- (b) Conversion Attempts. A charge is allowed after the ball is grounded. After the ball has once made contact with the ground, the kicker cannot again handle it, even if "no charge" is given.
