Gloucester are one of the strongest and most flourishing Clubs in the West Country, and it is, therefore, with pleasure that we welcome them to The Reddings this afternoon. However, we sympathise with them on learning that, on account of a SATURDAY County Match, Gloucestershire v. Devon at Exeter, their XV will be deprived of the services of Bill Hook, International full-back, Roy Sutton, centre three-quarter, and Gordon Hudson, a wing forward who played for England against the Kiwis in 1947. Also fly-half H. L. Terrington, the late Leicester player, was injured last Saturday and will be unable to play.

However, the Gloucester Club can still field a first class XV from its considerable reserve strength. Indeed, a playing record of:—Played 12 — Won 8 — Lost 3 — Drawn 1 are figures which confirm this fact. Two of the matches Gloucester have played are well worthy of mention. In a 'terrific' home game with Bedford they made their opponents suffer a first defeat of the season, while against Leicester, after being 16—3 down at half-time and one player short, they pulled up to 16—14 only to suffer the dissapointment of seeing the 'Tigers' tear away and score a final try in the last minute.
