NOTES

After easy Gloucester wins in 1946/7 (27-9 home) and 1947/8 (15-0 home and 14-8 away), Bath have more than held their own in the past two seasons, winning 13-3 and 14-11 at Bath, and losing by only 6-0 and 3-0 at Kingsholm.

This season they have developed into an attractive combination and the young players, Hambly and Donnelly (wings) and John (outside-half) have had much to do with their success, while they have been much strengthened by Sullivan and Hill (Bristol) and Addenbrooke (Swansea). T. Lewis (Dorset and Wilts.) is a strong wing-forward, while Dr. Todd, the skipper in 1948/9, has returned to the team. Bath's record to date is P. 18 : W. 11 : D. 2 : L. 5. Points 147-111.

Without the usual wings, Gloucester bring in M. Baker and C. Beamish. The latter broke his arm after a few games with the first XV last season and was unable to play again until recently. V. Davies will be away during school holidays.
