Rugby in general and Gloucester rugby in particular has lost a great stalwart by the passing of Eric Keys, an old player and Committeeman of the Gloucester Club. Although interested in many sports his chief was in Rugby, particularly in the English Schools Rugby Union, in which he played a great part since its inception in 1905. He served it for a period as Hon. Secretary and President. He was also on the Committee of the Gloucester County Rugby Union, being its President in 1947.

For the Newport match on April 14th, Stand Season Ticket Holders should be in their seats by 2-55 p.m., up to which time seats will be reserved.

The Final of the North Gloucestershire Combination Senior Cup, Coney Hill v. Spartans, will be played at Kingsholm on Thursday, April 19th at 6-15 p.m.
