We could have no more famous club with 'which to finish our home programme than Gloucester and so we extend to them a very special welcome anticipating the usual keen fast and open game. This fixture was originally fixed for February 14th, but we gave way to allow Gloucester to play Cambridge University in aid of the Gloucester Cathedral Restoration Fund. It will be remembered that the game we arranged to play here with Metropolitan Police was scratched owing to snow but had it been with Gloucester possibly the ground would have been cleared and the match played, but the conditions would have been far different from what they are this evening.
