OUR SENIORS

TERE in Gloucester we are very proud of the fact that our Rugby Football Club was founded in 1873. Our Dublin Visitors this evening belong to a club five years our senior, for it first began to function in 1868.

During that long period, Dublin Wanderers have contributed no fewer than 61 Internationals to the game. Two very famous ones between the wars were J. D. Clinch and Mark Sugden, others were P. F. Murray and C. R. A. Graves and in more recent years R. Kavanagh.

To-day the Dublin Club has a membership of 950 and fields six teams regularly every Saturday and sometimes seven when grounds are available. The details available when this programme had to be written shows that the side to appear here is very much star-studded.

ESPITE the fact that the present Irish International full-back, Bill Gector could not make the trip, there were four Internationals (in addition to Peter Young) from which the team could be selected. They are J. R. Notley (stand off half), W. A. O'Neill, R. J. Kavanagh and P. Kavanagh (forwards). In addition N. Brophy (wing three-quarter), R. F. O'Reilly (scrum half) and J. Swan (forward) have all appeared in the Irish Final Trial. So Gloucester, you have been warned!
