The visit of Bristol to-day has been awaited with great pleasure and keen anticipation. We, at Kingsholm, recognise the power and strength of this, the most successful English club this season. Bristol have achieved many notable victories this season, including Cardiff. We can assure them of no easy passage to-day – the Cherry and Whites have a few notable scalps under their belts and are hopeful of adding that of Bristol to their number.

To-day's match will be the 22nd encounter between the teams since the war. Of these games Gloucester have won ten and drawn five and have achieved the double twice, in seasons 1947-48 and 1951-52, Our 22 - 20 win at Bristol in 1954-55 was the highest scoring game in the series until our 29-17 defeat earlier this season. In this same period Bristol have defeated us on six occasions, including a double victory last season, which was only their third win at Kingsholm since season 1929-30.
