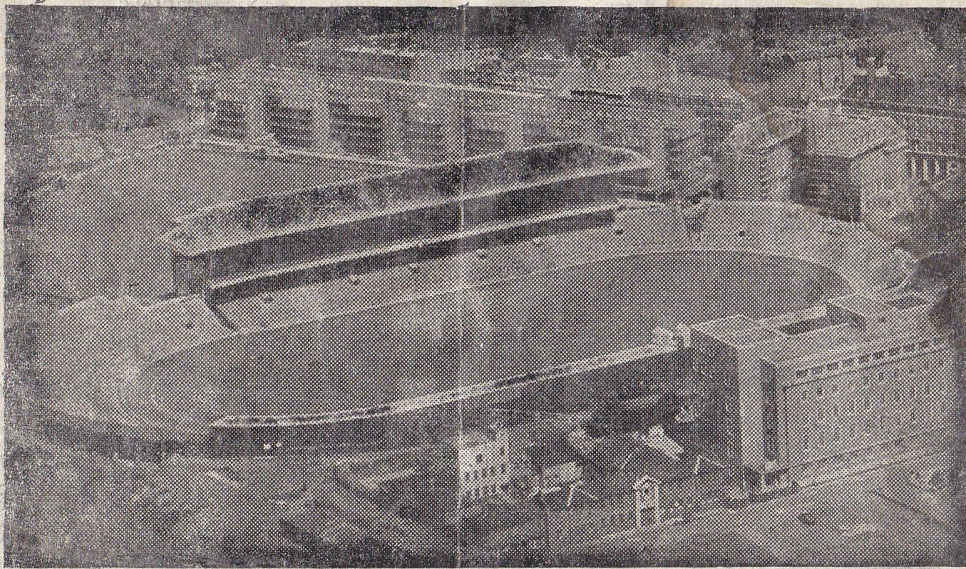

# **Cardiff v. Gloucester**

Welcome to Gloucester, one of the most famous sides in the country who have been playing against Cardiff since 1882.

In the match played at Gloucester earlier in the season, Cardiff won by 11 points to 5. The Blue and Blacks have won all the matches played between the two sides in the past five seasons with the exception of our away game last season when we were beaten by 3 points to nil.

The Cardiff team returned by air from Cornwall on Wednesday last after a successful tour, winning two of their matches with the third game drawn. In this encounter against St. Ives, the Blue and Blacks were unfortunate to lose the services of Maldwyn Gough in the first seconds of the game with a leg injury and later Ian James was taken off with concussion and had to remain in hospital when the team returned to Cardiff. This was indeed unfortunate and we wish Ian a speedy recovery. His place today is being taken by Tommy McCarthy who is a most promising youngster.

We are nearing the end of the season with its customary dearth of mid-week matches. Next Wednesday on the Arms Park, Cardiff entertain Pontypool, one of the best sides in Wales this season and this should be a real crowd-puller and give our supporters the opportunity of seeing Colin Evans and Benny Jones who have seriously challenged for the Welsh team half-back places this season.

Tickets for the Cardiff Past v. Present match in aid of the late Sid Judd's widow and children, are now on sale, price—Stand 4/-; Field and Enclosure 1/6d. and will be available before, during and after to-days game at selling points at approaches to and inside the ground.

The game will take place on the Arms Park on the evening of the 30th April and we ask all followers of rugby to purchase a ticket to support this worthy cause.
