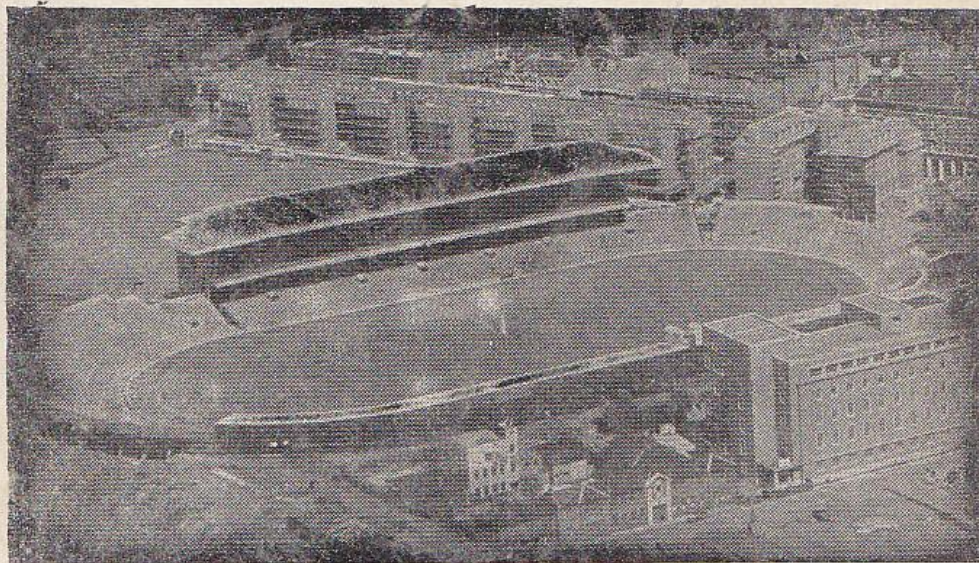

Cardiff v. Gloucester

After two strenuous away matches, Cardiff return to the Park this evening to entertain our old friends from Gloucester.

In recent seasons the Blue and Blacks have enjoyed a good run of success against their old rivals from Kingsholm, winning all the matches played except one.

The Cardiff team has regained some of its former lustre with two excellent away wins in the past two matches against Pontypool and Coventry. In both these matches the Blue and Blacks looked a different side from that which had played on the Park in earlier matches and if Skipper Gordon Wells and his men can maintain this form, then we shall enjoy an excellent season. There are still some minor faults which need attention, mainly in the scrummaging and line-out play and no doubt these points received attention at last night's team practice.
