The Committee like to feel that this did not indicate that Members had no interest in improving the Club facilities, but rather that they were not clear as to what was required of them. Your Committee has therefore decided to test the support for a Shilling-a-Week Pool and we would appeal to all Members and Supporters of the Club to leave their names and addresses with the Secretary if they would be prepared to support the Club in this way.

If every Member could get 10 to 20 friends or acquaintances to support the Pool the scheme would be an outstanding success. All we ask at this stage, therefore, is that you should let us know the answer to two questions:—

- (a) Would you act as an Agent for a Football Pool each Agent would receive a percentage of the money he collected and do you think you could get 10 to 20 people to subscribe each week?
- (b) If not possible to act as an Agent would you be prepared to support the Pool to the extent of one shilling a week?

As a matter of interest, 80% of the Committee members present at the last Meeting indicated they could get 20 people to subscribe each week.

The prizes would, of course, increase as the Pool increases, but at the commencement the minimum prize would be £30 a week.
