This evening we welcome Bath for the match which was originally due to be played last December, but was postponed because of a County replay.

Like Gloucester, our visitors have been suffering from injuries in recent weeks, and will not be at full strength. They have had an indifferent season, but have always tried to play open rugger, as can be seen from the number of points they have scored and conceded. Their full record is:

Four well-known players missing from their ranks for this game are Geoff Frankcom, who has returned to Cambridge University; their vice-captain Brendan Perry, out for the rest of the season with a torn muscle; hooker Pat Hill, nursing a broken ankle; and Laurie Rimmer, who is working away and is unavailable for midweek matches.

It is interesting to note that centre Margretts is a master at Kingswood School – and winger Monahon is one of his pupils!

Wing-forward Tom Martland, highly spoken of as a future England player, broke his wrist playing for Dorset and Wilts against Gloucestershire, but makes his return for this match. Also included is that hardy veteran, Leighton Jenkins, the former International, who, like Tennyson's brook, seems to go on and on, and is reputed to be playing as well as ever.
