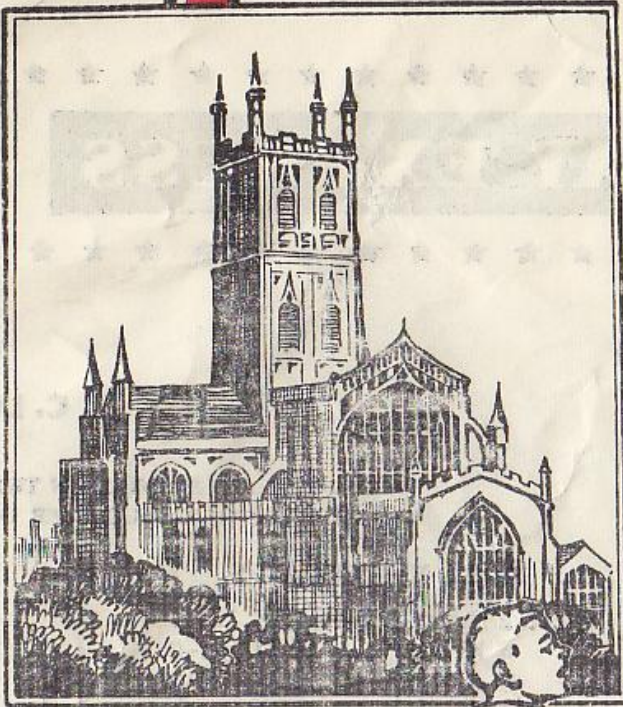

Not only do we hope to see brilliant rugger from them - we expect it; and rarely, if ever, are we disappointed. Our game last season with the 'Quins was generally voted the best seen at Kingsholm for a long time, and we look forward to such another match this afternoon.

In that spectacular game last season, on October 10th, 1964, Gloucester brought off a great victory by 19 points to 16 to capture Harlequins' unbeaten record at that time. Don Rutherford was in excellent kicking form, landing two penalty goals and converting both the tries scored by Dick Smith and Brian "Baggy" Hudson, the other points came from a dropped goal by David Ainge.

The unexpected sight of snow in April caused the postponement of our match against neighbouring Cheltenham on Thursday evening. The fixture has not been lost, however, for our friends from Cheltenham have kindly agreed to play the match on Monday evening at Kingsholm (kick-off 6.15 p.m.)

Gloucester United were originally due to play Cheltenham Utd. here on that date, but this game has now been switched to the Athletic Ground and will be played on Tuesday evening instead.

Kingsholm will be the Mecca for most rugger enthusiasts next week, for the match with Cheltenham on Monday evening is followed over the next three days by the two North Glos. Combination Cup Finals.

On Tuesday evening, April 19th, there is the Junior Final between British Nylon Spinners and Painswick, the former making their first ever appearance at Kingsholm. It will be a repeat line-up of last season in the Senior Final next Thursday, April 21st, when Gordon League will spare no effort to stop unbeaten Matson from winning the trophy for the fourth successive year.

The kick-off time for both the cup finals is 6.15 p.m.
